



THE ORIGIN OF ACHIEVEMENT WEEK



Dr. Carter G. Woodson

The genesis behind what is now Achievement Week is found at a significant event that occurred in Omega's history at the 9th Grand Conclave held at Meharry Medical College in Nashville from December 27-29, 1920. It was at this Conclave that Dr. Carter G. Woodson gave a stirring speech during the opening session on Monday evening, December 27, 1920, on "Democracy and the Man Far Down." According to a fraternal publication, in his speech, Dr. Woodson:

"mentioned the Negro's neglect of his history, in fact, his ignorance of it, and urged the college man to give less attention to social affairs and devote more of his time to the study and dissemination of the facts of Negro life and history. Such knowledge, he maintained, would produce an increase in the number of competent Negro leaders and would inspire race pride in the masses as a whole."

So moved were the Brothers of the 9th Conclave that a decision was made by the body to designate a week for a public campaign on the study of Negro Literature and History. This was entitled the Campaign for the Study of Negro Literature and History. The responsibility of executing Omega's first national campaign was given to William Stuart Nelson, who was elected to the newly created national position of Director of Publicity for the Fraternity at the Nashville Conclave.

The inaugural campaign was held from April 24-30, 1921, over 104 years ago. Mass public meetings were held by Chapters featuring prominent speakers, and pamphlets were printed and distributed to attendees, students, and the community discussing the accomplishments

and history of African Americans. Folders were sent to the Black press containing facts on Negro history. Reporting from Atlanta, Grand Basileus Harold H. Thomas noted:

"The campaign has been a howling success all over the country, and more than a success in Atlanta. Eta's big mass meeting was attended by over two thousand people, and Omicron held their open meeting in a large church Friday night. Omega men during the week have spoken in every institution of learning in the city including colleges, grammar schools, and private schools."

In 1926, so as not to compete with Woodson's newly launched Negro History Week, under the direction of John Prescott Murchison, the national and local celebration changed

to the first or second week of November with the focus on the achievements of African Americans not only in the past but currently across a vast diaspora of fields. The end goal was to "inject racial pride and to stimulate, enrich, and direct the innate powers of Negro youth." The new name of this initiative became Negro Achievement Week, Omega's first national program.

This effort and success laid the foundation for what Achievement Week is today. Now over 700 Chapters celebrate the achievements of local leaders in their community annually during November each year to encourage and celebrate African American pride and success.

JOHN F. HOWARD

It has been said that “True humility is being able to accept criticisms as graciously as we accept compliments.” No better description more aptly describes the essence of **John F. Howard**.

A 2003 Cum Laude honors graduate of Fort Valley State University, **John** earned a Bachelor of Business Administration degree with a concentration in accounting. Never content with average, he went on to secure a Master’s in Accounting from Strayer University in 2009.

As an accomplished business executive with a comprehensive blend of nonprofit, governmental, and corporate management experience, **John** began a career as a senior auditor for international professional services giant PriceWaterhouse Coopers LLP. It is noteworthy that much of his professional career has been centered in finance and business operations, areas in which he has excelled with relative ease.

Upon departing PwC in 2009, **John** launched Howard and Associates; he established his very own accounting practice providing quality bookkeeping, auditing, and non-profit accounting services for an assortment of clientele.

In 2010, **John** shifted his career focus and began work at the **Omega Psi Phi Fraternity International Headquarters** (IHQ) as the **Director of Finance**. Just one year later, in 2011, at 29 years old, **John** became the youngest **Interim Executive Director** of the Fraternity. In 2015, he became the organization’s **Assistant Executive Director**, charged with the responsibility of managing the day-to-day operations of IHQ.

After faithfully serving Omega in his previous role, a promotion loomed on the horizon. On August 31, 2020, **John** was unanimously and officially selected to serve as the Fraternity’s 12th **Executive Director**, the youngest at the age of 39 to ever serve in this senior role.

John remains a dedicated mentor, progressive leader, innovator, and athletic coach. Additionally, he is a loving husband and father of 3 children.



THE INTRODUCTION OF ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS



1956 Awardee Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr.

In 1931, Pi Omega Chapter introduced as part of its Achievement Week the Maryland Negro Achievement Award for Distinguished Service. This award was presented to "the man or woman of Maryland who makes the most outstanding contribution to civilization during the year." They are the first Chapter in the Fraternity to issue such an award.

Several years later, in 1939, the national Achievement Week Committee, led by future Grand Basileus Campbell C. Johnson, recommended to the 28th Grand Conclave in New York that "local chapters setup Achievement awards ... selecting the most outstanding person in their local area." Additionally, they recommended that "a national Omega Psi Phi

Achievement Award for outstanding achievement be established and presented annually at the public meeting during the Grand Conclave ... to the man as having made the most outstanding contribution culminating within the year in any worthwhile field of endeavor." Finally, they proposed "an additional award be made to the Omega man chosen by the Achievement Committee as having performed the most outstanding service to the Fraternity during the year." The Grand Conclave adopted all three recommendations. Subsequently, at this Conclave, Judge William H. Hastie was the first awardee of the National Omega Psi Phi Achievement Award for his achievement in the legal profession. In 1949, the name of the award would be changed to Outstanding Citizen of the Year.

Since that time, such individuals as Jackie Robinson (1947), Thurgood Marshall (1951), Lorraine Hansberry (1959), James Meredith (1962), Senator Edward Brooke (1967), Vernon Jordan (1971), and Earl Graves (1974) have received this award. In 2019, Atlanta Mayor Keisha Lance Bottoms was selected as Delta Mu Mu Chapter's Citizen of the Year and went on to be chosen as the International Citizen of the Year by the Fraternity. Most recently, in 2023, Fulton County District Attorney Fani Willis was selected as Delta Mu Mu Chapter's Citizen of the Year and was chosen by the State of Georgia, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity as its Citizen of the Year.


The program not only provided a platform for these students to shine but also fostered a sense of unity and pride within the community.



This fatherhood and mentorship-based plan was developed to initiate a means to bridge the gap of some social needs requiring attention within the local youth environment. The five-week program introduced the basics of being a gentleman, how to tie a tie, manly social interactions, and pleasantries, S.T.E.M., and the importance of time management.

The program began with thirty-three participants from the 4th and 5th grade population of boys selected from an application and a signed contract by the parents and students to take part in the program. Twenty-two of the young men

successfully completed the five-week program through participation and involvement. The parents and teaching staff noticed subtle differences within those pupils who were fully engaged within the program. The Aviano School's leadership have expressed an interest in having the program expand to the middle and high school levels and return to the elementary program for administering.

DID YOU KNOW THERE WERE 2 CHAPTERS PRESENT IN GERMANY?



The Theta Rho International Chapter looks forward to continuing its mission of uplift and service and is excited to see the community again at our next event. Your participation and support make a real difference!






